Nelson Mandela








- Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela (18 July 1918 5 December 2013) was a South African revolutionary, politician, and philanthropist, who served as President of South Africa from 1994 to 1999.
- He was the country's first black head of state and the first elected in a democratic election.
- Mandela served 27 years in prison for raising his voice against the injustices against coloured South Africans.
- Widely regarded as an icon of democracy and social justice, he received more than 250 honours—including the Nobel Peace Prize (1993) and the Bharat Ratna (1990).



- Samuel L. Clemens (November 30, 1835 April 21, 1910) better known by his pen name Mark Twain, was an American writer, publisher, and lecturer.
- Among his novels are The Adventures of Tom Sawyer and its sequel, The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn.
- Twain was raised in Hannibal, Missouri, US which later provided the setting for Tom
 Sawyer and Huckleberry Finn

- Reckon-calculate / be of the opinion


- O Consent- Give permission.




- Discuss Work and Play
